Matthew 24: 37-44

The cause for sainthood for Australian-born doctor and missionary in India Mary Glowrey has advanced after Pope Leo XIV recognised her 'heroic virtues' on 21 November 2025. Venerable Mary of the Sacred Heart Glowrey, as she will now be titled, is just the second Australian, after Saint Mary MacKillop, to be accorded this status.

Pope Leo's decree marks the second major step in the formal process toward sainthood, signifying that the Church has officially found evidence of a life marked by extraordinary virtue. The next phase, beatification, will require the approval of a miracle attributed to her intercession.

Quick facts about Venerable Mary of the Sacred Heart Glowrey

Biography

- Born Birregurra, Victoria, 23 June, 1887; died Bangalore (Bengaluru), India, 5 May 1957
- Graduated from University of Melbourne MBBS 1910, MD 1919
 Medical positions in Melbourne included those at the Royal Victorian Eye and Ear Hospital and St Vincent's Hospital Melbourne, and at a private practice in Collins Street.

- Left Australia 21 January 1920 and travelled to Guntur, in present-day Andhra Pradesh. Never returned to Australia
- Joined the Society of Jesus Mary Joseph (now called the Congregation of Jesus Mary Joseph) in Guntur, India, in 1920
- As a religious sister, known as Sr Mary of the Sacred Heart JMJ.

The canonisation process

- A member of the Catholic Church who is found to have lived a life of 'heroic virtue', after an extensive investigation and documentation of their life, is granted the title 'Venerable'.
 - If a miracle, usually an unexplained medical cure, is established to have taken place as a result of the Venerable's intercession, they can be beatified and have the title 'Blessed'.
- Sainthood, or canonisation, may take place if a second miracle is established.

Archbishop Comensoli encouraged the faithful across Australia and beyond to keep her cause for canonisation in prayer.

"May the day come when the Church names her Saint Mary of the Sacred Heart," he said. "May she pray for us and help us walk ever more closely with Christ".
